

The councillors are very aware of the relentless reports and comments about the excessive speed and inappropriate driving of certain vehicles passing through the village. It is not just a Kilham problem, but seems to be a county wide problem and we are committed to working with our neighbouring parish councils to trial measures designed to discourage recklessness and at the same time encourage responsible behaviour.

Over the past couple of months, the parish council has responded to a number of controversial planning application, we were pleased to engage with the residents who attended our meetings expressing their concerns and worries. A recent amended planning application for Land North of White Hall Close saw a number of residents at our November meeting and below is a section of our response forwarded to ERYC planning department: -

'A large number of residents attended the November's Parish Council meeting to express their concerns about this proposed development. They are furious that their private road should be assumed to be a public right of way which it is clearly not. Kilham Parish Council unequivocally support residents in their opposition to this amended application.'

As you will have noticed once again we have a stunning Christmas tree located in Memorial Gardens, we wish to thank Jeff and Megan Price from Classic Interiors who have sponsored this year's tree. Thank you must also go to the team of volunteers who give their time to erect and decorate the tree.

Dear all,

The countdown to Christmas is well underway and plenty happening in the village and at church. We all know that Christmas is a time of great joy, giving and receiving; but it is also a time where we remember those less fortunate than ourselves.

I'd like to say a huge thanks to those who have been doing just that these past weeks. At the beginning of November we received about 30 shoeboxes as part of our 'Love in a box" shoebox appeal. These were blessed during a service (with some lovely singing from our village children) and sent on their way to various refugee camps via the Jacobs Well charity in Beverley.

Also in November we reached 1000 items of food, clothing and linen that have been so kindly donated by Kilham folk. We keep a basket at the back of church for people to put stuff in that we re-distribute to the homeless and hungry via the Rainbow Centre in Scarborough and Kingfisher Café in Bridlington.

We have another project on the go throughout December (Sox-ember!). The idea is to put a pair of warm socks, scarf, mittens/gloves, perhaps even a bag of sweets or chocolate in a Christmas bag. Any that are brought to the church will reach homeless people in our area in time for Christmas. If you want to help/give then drop your gifts either at the church (Sunday morning around service times, Wednesday lunchtime or even leave them anytime in the box in the church porch which will be emptied every day) or you can leave stuff with Trish in the school office (before December 15th). Once again thank you, in anticipation of your continued generosity.

As usual on the events and services front we have a great line up for Advent and Christmas. I do hope there will be something for everyone of us, where we will have fun, celebrate, find meaning and make sure we remember the greatest gift of all— Christmas starts with Christ.



FRACKING IN KILHAM

A Freedom of Information Request has revealed 'Exploration Plans' for North and East Yorkshire. These plans include <u>Kilham</u> (PEDL 332)

North Yorkshire County Council has released correspondence between themselves and INEOS Shale. These emails highlight five of INEOS' Petroleum Exploration and Development Licences (PEDLS) 282, 283, 289, 291 and 332. They cover such areas as Malton, part of York, Sheriff Hutton, Strensal, Kirkham Abbey, Settrington, Kirby Grindale, Thixendale, Sledmere and Kilham.

The exploration plans include:

- 1. Review existing 2D and 3D seismic survey data.
- 2. Carry out its own seismic surveys.
- 3. Submit planning applications for vertical coring wells

INEOS has already begun analysing existing seismic data and identifying potential sites for core wells.

Timescale: According to the emails, the company had hoped to begin seismic surveys later in 2017 and expects to have plans submitted, to drill vertical core wells, within the next two years.

Exploratory fracking is taking place at Kirby Misperton in North Yorkshire.

Free Broadband in the Village Hall

Cllr Horner was asked to look into the possibility of having broadband installed in the village hall. He looked at the benefits having broadband would bring to the village hall. Once he had completed his research Cllr Horner was asked to prepare and present his findings in the form of a PowerPoint presentation to the Kilham Village Hall Association committee and has liaised with them over the past 3 months to try to get approval for the installation of broadband in the village hall for the use of the village. He has contacted several providers and finally agreed to go with Plusnet. His findings were presented to the KVHA committee at their last meeting and it was agreed for the installation to go ahead. Cllr Horner has also donated a laptop to the village hall for use with the broadband.

The contract is a business contract for unlimited fibre broadband for 2 years and is totally funded by a grant from the Kilham Parish Council.

A new phone line will need to be installed and this is scheduled for Wednesday 22 November. The broadband will be free to use by anyone using the village hall.
