### **Field Update**

Last month we planted a further 45 native trees and large shrubs funded by those choosing to Sponsor a Tree at the 2023 Kilham 10k and supplied by Castle Howard Nursery.

Should anyone have any spare native wildflower seeds to enhance our wildflower area at the top of the field please get in touch or find a patch of soil up there and scatter them in.

This month we will be installing a new basket swing into the playground area. This has been supported by funds from the Tesco Community Grant scheme and the Ricoh UK Ltd Community Sponsorship Fund.

In 2024 we hope to add in further new items for the next phase of our play equipment project. A future project is then enhancing the entrance to the field with a landscaped picnic area and the relining of the multi surface area.

## News from Kilham School

Kilham C of E Primary School has been busy competing in many local sporting events this week and joining in Safer Internet Day, when the theatre company Divergent Drama came into school to deliver their E-safety workshop to children.

'What would you do?' is their new E-safety workshop that brings to life many of the issues connected to staying safe online. This interactive workshop puts the pupil in the driving seat and shows how their decisions could affect the lives of people around them. During this workshop, an actor recounted true-life stories of victims of online predators. These stories differ for age groups; they include gaming, social media, web chats and cyberbullying. Students at school were encouraged to consider the mental impact of growing up in a digital age and be equipped with ways to protect themselves against any negative impacts.

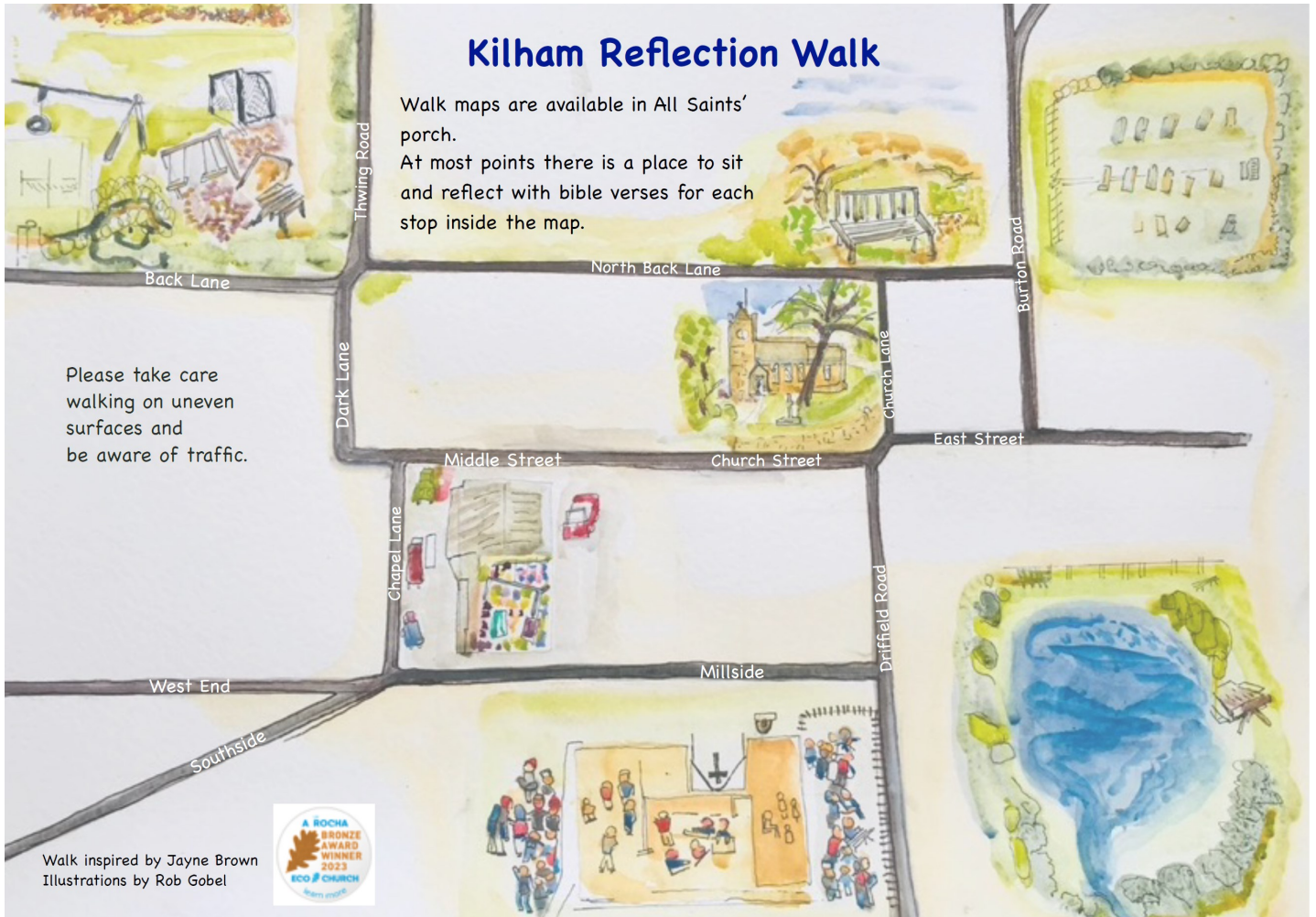


A Year 6 student reflected on what she had learnt: “ On safer internet day, we had a school visitor who taught us how to stay safe online. She taught us about the word SMART and what it stands for. It means – SAFE, MEETING, ACCEPTING, RELIABLE and TELL. The visitor also spoke about banter – she said that banter is often unacceptable and that if someone is saying things you do not like, you should always tell them. If someone tells you that they are being upset by what you are saying – you should stop straight away. We learnt that banter can sometimes go too far and end up negatively damaging people’s mental health and well-being.”

Class 1 have had a very exciting last week recently, kicking off with a visit from Ripon Owl sanctuary on Wednesday! We had an eagle owl, a barn owl and an elf owl flying around the classroom as well as a Harris Hawk. The children all got to hold the small elf owl and witness the other amazing birds fly for food and explore the class-room. It was a brilliant way to end our ‘Starry Night’ topic.

On Friday we learnt all about Lunar New Year. We explored china on Google Earth and learnt all about the different animals the years are named after. We learnt how people prepare for and celebrate Lunar New Year and then got to try some yummy Chinese food! We had lots of lovely role play and artwork come from the day and I am sure that all the children had a wonderful time.
