

News From Kilham Parish Council

As you will know the start of the year has come with the challenge of more flooding in the village. The Parish Council is in the process of arranging a public meeting with Yorkshire Water, EYRC and the Environment Agency to discuss what can be done in the future. Once we have more information we will announce it on the notice board and website. In the meantime we are arranging for independent water testing to check for contamination.



The Parish Council can not fight this alone, we need all residents affected by the flooding to inform both ERYC and Yorkshire Water, the more voices they hear the better. We want to collate all the complaints/incidents connected to the flooding in order to produce a report to present to the authorities. This will help to make a solid case for action to be taken.

To enable us to do this please send your experiences, including details of the problems and how long they have existed plus any action you have taken including contact with third parties, by email

We would like to take this opportunity to ask for your help on another matter - If a bus service was provided through the village would you use it and how often?

The councillors wish to explore the possibility of working with ERYC/bus company to see whether a service to Driffield, to start with, could be provided. Again using the same email address as above, please let us know as we will need to demonstrate there is a need.

Willy Howe Model Flying Club and Kilham School

On 20th January 2024, Willy Howe Model Flying Club received the Roger Bedford Memorial Trophy and commemorative Certificate, awarded by the British Model Flying Club Awards Committee for the Flying Club's outstanding contribution to education in the context of Aeromodelling during 2023.

The Trophy was presented to the Flying Club's Chairman, Ian Howard by Andy Symons, BMFA Club Support Officer, at Kilham Primary School. The Club will shortly be working together with the School's Head Teacher, Robert Palmer, on a series of After-School STEM Club flight related activities that follow on from a recent presentation made by the Club Chairman to the Year 6 children as part of their WW2 topic.

Also in the photograph, Pupils are shown holding a camera drone and remote controller that were purchased with the assistance of a Grant awarded to the Flying Club by the Dogger Bank Wind Farm. The drone will be used during relevant flight activities with the Pupils during the STEM Club programme.

The Wind Farm Grant Administrators are keen to conduct a case study regarding the Flying Club's projects, especially the continuing involvement with the STEM Club and their study will feature on the Dogger Bank Website, Social Media channels and an internal post on where the funding goes to inform the wider staff team within the Wind Farm."

Information from Mr Palmer

Kilham C of E Primary School would like to congratulate the club on this award and are excited to continue working with the team from the Willy Howe Model Flying Club. The club have worked with the school over a number of years coming into school to deliver exciting workshops about aircraft from World War 1 and World War 2. After Easter we will be working together, delivering a STEM based after school club to children at Kilham School.

This will involve activities to build, design and launch a 3D rocket. Children will be using Tinkercad (a free online 3D design tool) and the schools 3D printer to complete a finished rocket. Children will also get chance to fly the new drone that the club have purchased



with Dogger Bank funding. We are also hoping that we will encourage younger children to have an interest in model aircraft and possibly become members of the club.

Kilham School are passionate about engaging our children in STEM based learning, our work with the club on an after school club will support this area of our school curriculum.
