Spring is slowly bringing the countryside to life, daffodils are coming into bloom and farmers are trying to get back into the fields. With this in mind could we ask, that due to the roadside verges being very soft because of the wet conditions, you please allow enough road for agricultural vehicles to pass safely so they do not have to churn up the grass.

BT are giving communities the opportunity to adopt phone boxes, as Kilham's phone box is Grade II listed and a visual part of the village, the Parish Council has taken the decision to adopt the box, looking to repurpose it at some time in the future.

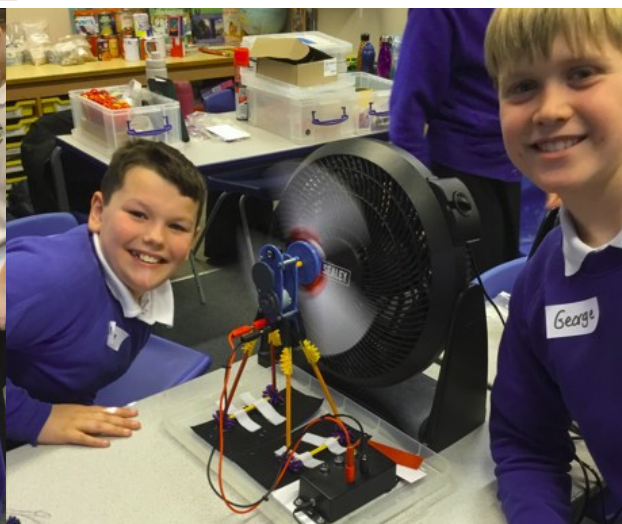
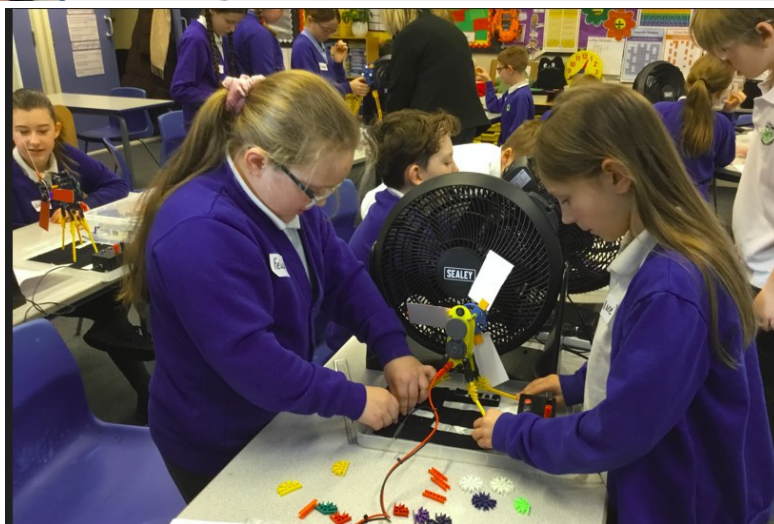
electricity for their wind energy business and country.
