Kilham Parish Council

At the September Parish Council meeting, we were pleased to welcome Leo Hammond, the Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner, who joined us to discuss how to combat speeding in rural communities.

Mr. Hammond outlined several initiatives aimed at making our roads safer, including Operation Snap, which allows residents to submit dashcam or helmet cam footage of dangerous driving directly to the police. He also announced that helmet cameras are now being provided to horse riders, helping to document incidents and raise awareness of their vulnerability on the roads. You may also have seen that the local police have been in the village with the speed gun and have successfully identified a number of drivers speeding, we are hoping this will be a regular occurrence.

The council welcomed Mr. Hammond's insights and the continued focus on improving road safety in our area.

We are also pleased to report that the Parish Council has secured funding from the Lissett Wind Farm Fund to purchase four Village Gateways. These are to be installed at key entrances to the village and are intended to help encourage drivers to slow down as they enter the village.

A Polite Reminder About Parking

We'd also like to remind residents not to park on grass verges or obstruct public footpaths. These areas are essential for pedestrian safety, and when blocked, they force people—including wheelchair users and those with prams—into the road, which can be both dangerous and distressing. Please Park considerately. Let's work together to keep our village safe and accessible for everyone.

The September speaker was Gina, The Coastal Celebrant, who gave us an interesting insight into her work.

We meet on the second Tuesday of the month in the Village Hall at 7.15 and are always happy to welcome visitors.

Our October meeting will be a talk on Burnby Hall Gardens and in November we will be taste testing various products.
